The Presidium of the European Tenpin Bowling Federation (ETBF) held its meeting on 31 January and 1 February 2003 in Veghel, The Netherlands. All members of the Presidium were present as well as the two elected auditors Mr. Bengt E. Lindbergh from Sweden and Mr. Jan Edvardsen from Norway.

The auditors inspected the presented financial statements over the year 2002. The inspection over the year 2001 was already done in Brussels, Belgium on 8 and 9 February 2002. The results/report will be delivered to the Congress of ETBF when it meets on Friday 9 May 2003 in Poznan, Poland. More details about the venue will be published soon.

I will try to report about the Presidium meeting as brief and yet complete as possible. Should there be any questions/remarks, please do not hesitate to call or write me.

The number of pages viewed of the website www.etbf.dk was in 2002 again higher than last year. Considering it is NOT a newspaper, but an information page for the member federations, the Presidium is happy with the results.

The Presidium prepared a number of changes to the chapters 1 thru 5 of our rules. They will be presented to the Congress in May 2003. Proposals shall be sent latest 8 April 2003 to the member federations.

Thanks to the efforts of our Vice President Mr. Kim Thorsgaard Jensen, the Presidium is proud to be able to give to the hosts of ETBF Championships a CD Rom with the National anthems and a complete set of two national flags per country.

The national flags are the property of the ETBF and will be sent to the next host immediately after the event has been completed. During the championships the flags are the responsibility of the host federation. The flags will be used for the first time during the European Youth Cup Teams in Schiedam, The Netherlands.

The Presidium also discussed the ETBF Championships for the period 2004-2006.

A formal application has been received from Germany to host the EYC in 2004 in the city of Augsburg. Formal applications are still to be received from Ukraine for the EGC 2004, from Greece for the ECT 2004 and from Hungary for the ECI 2004.

During the Congress in May 2003 we will discuss the applications for the Champion ships in 2005 and 2006. We are also expecting applications for the European Women Championships in 2007.

The next ETBF Presidium meeting will be held on 7 May 2003 in Poznan, Poland during the European Gold Cup. The ETBF Congress will be held on 9 May 2003 also in Poznan, Poland. More information will be sent as soon as possible.

Story 2003-05: Message from the President

The 17th Nordic Youth Championships - just concluded in the Swedish capital Stockholm - introduced a brand new and existing format, primarily based on round robins in all disciplines. In the NYC 2003 three disciplines was played in each sex; Doubles, Team and Masters. In each of the disciplines the standings was decided based on points won instead of pin fall and the pin fall only to be used in case of ties in the point standings.

In addition to the three girl's disciplines and the three boy's disciplines a new Nations Event was introduced (common for both sexes). The Nations Event was decided by adding all points won in the two Double Events and the two Team Events together with points given for the 12 players ranked after the conclusion of the two Round Robins and the following two Stepladder Finals.

In total 7 medal sets to play for in the NYC 2003.

Sweden was - as many times before in the Nordic region - the major successor with 5 gold medals, 4 silver medals and 2 bronze medals. Finland won 1 gold medal, 2 silver medals and 2 bronze medals while Denmark won 1 gold medal, 1 silver medal and 3 bronze medals. No medals were won by the Norwegian and the Icelandic team.

A very sovereign Swedish girls' team was the driving force behind the Swedish success by winning the Girl's Team Event and all three medal-sets in the Girl's Doubles and in the Girl's Masters as well.

The new individual Nordic Youth Champions is Martina Haakansson and Mikael Kanold, both from Sweden

From WTBA the highest ranked woman and the highest ranked man at the end of the 2002 rankings will be invited from each of the three Zones. Also invited will be the male and the female winners of the 2003 World Ranking Masters. In total 8 invited from WTBA.

Story 2003-07: EYCT revised ball check rule

The WTBA Rule 308 was amended in 2002 to replace the obligation to have all bowling balls inspected prior to the Official Practise with a requirement of random inspection during the competition. However, at the WTTC 2003 in Odense, Denmark it was revealed that the amended WTBA Rule 308 could not be used to the full extent.

In order not to face the same problem at the European Youth Cup Teams 2003 in Schiedam, The Netherlands, the ETBF Presidium has decided that the following shall apply instead of the Rule 308 of the WTBA Playing Rules.

Bowling Ball Procedure

Only bowling balls that are included on the ABC/WIBC Approved Bowling Ball list may be used in competition.

Altering the surface of bowling balls is permitted during the Official Practice and between the blocks of games. It is not allowed during the practice session before a block of games or during a block of games.

Prior to the start of the Official Practise the bowling balls to be used during competition shall be inspected. Each player will be allowed to have a maximum of 6 bowling balls inspected.

The inspection shall be limited to: Eligibility of the ball Serial Number Weight and balance Hardness Number of balls

In case, immediately after the Official Practice, a player wants to exchange one or more of the inspected bowling balls, he/she will be allowed to do that provided the balls are inspected prior to registration of the ones to be used in competition.

Immediately following the Official Practice registration shall be made of the bowling balls to be used during the championship events. Each player will be permitted to register maximum 6 bowling balls. No replacements or additions will be allowed once the first event has started.

Each day during the events random inspection of the bowling balls shall be performed. The Tournament Technical Committee shall decide on the number of balls and the players, which shall be randomly selected. The inspection shall be limited to the serial number of the balls.

Note:

The official list of approved bowling balls is published on the Internet website www.bowl.com.

Note:

In very special circumstances the Tournament Technical Committee may allow a replacement of a registered bowling ball.

Note:

A maximum of five gripping holes are allowed in a bowling ball. The player must be able to reach each set of finger holes (not all four simultaneously) while using the thumb hole. Any hole, which cannot be reached, is considered a vent hole. The ball must be balanced twice when one set of finger-holes are for fingertip and the other set for conventional grip.

<u>Note</u>: When delivering the ball the player must have his/her thumb in or over the thumb hole. It may not be 180 degrees away from the thumb hole.

After the conclusion of the World Tenpin Team Cup last week, where the Finnish teams returned back home without medals, Finland was back at the top of the podium by winning 5 gold medals, 4 silver medals and 1 bronze medal. Sweden took 2 silver medals, 2 gold medals and 3 bronze medals, while the Norwegian team took 1 silver medal and 3 bronze medals.

The Women Masters of the NC 2003 was won by Piritta Kantola - Finland, whom defeated Minna Mäkelä - Finland 417-349 in the Final. In the second last match Piritta Kantola defeated Jessica Haakansson - Sweden 423-378.

Petteri Salonen from Finland came out as the winner of the Men Masters by defeating Osku Palermaa from Finland 495-480 in the final and Joonas Houlman from Finland 393-356 in the second last match.

The Malaysian Tenpin Bowling Congress, the host of the 15th World Championships, has released Bulletin no. 2 of this highlight of events in 2003. A resume of the bulletin content will be presented in this story.

The World Championships 2003 will be held in two bowling centres in the Malaysian capital Kuala Lumpur in the period 9-20 September 2003.

Pyramid Megalanes, Sunway Pyramid Shopping Centre

The 48 lanes AMF wood surface bowling centre will host the Men's competitions. The centre is located in Sunway Pyramid, an eight-store shopping mall adjacent to one of the official hotels, The Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel.

The centre was built in 1997 and was the venue for the highly successful 1998 Commonwealth Games.

Ampang Superbowl, the Summit, Subang USJ

The 32 lane AMF synthetic surface bowling centre will host the women's competition. The centre is located in the Summit USJ, a four-store shopping mall adjacent to one another of the official hotels, The Summit Hotel. The centre is only 10 - 15 minutes driving time from Sunway Pyramid.

The centre was built in 1999 and was a venue which hosted many international tournaments including the 21st KL International and the 5th Gentling International in 1999 and 2000.

Official hotels

There are five official hotels for the World Championships 2003.

Sunway Lagoon Resort

Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel, is a deluxe five star hotel complex adjacent to Sunway Pyramid Shopping Mall where the Pyramid Megalanes is located and is within 5 minutes walking distance. In addition to the excellent hotel facilities, the centre also offers unrivalled and distinctive convention, business and leisure facilities all under one roof.

The Hotel is close to Kuala Lumpur, the nation's capital city and 35 minutes from the Kuala Lumpur International Airport.

The hotel will house the main tournament secretariat, the team managers meeting and the World Championships 2003 victory banquet.

The Summit Hotel

The Summit Hotel is adjacent to The Summit USJ Shopping Centre where Ampang Superbowl is located and is within 3 minutes walking distance. In addition to the many hotel facilities, the shopping centre features Cineplex, food courts and a supermarket are within the complex.

Hotel Sheraton Subang

Hotel Sheraton Subang is located in between the two bowling centres and approximately 5 km from both Pyramid Megalanes and Ampang Superbowl Summit USJ. In addition to the many hotel facilities, the hotel is approximately 10 minutes' walk to Subang Parade shopping centre which features shops, food courts and a supermarket.

Hotel PJ Hilton

Hotel PJ Hilton is located approximately 5km to Pyramid Megalanes and a further 5km to Ampang Superbowl Summit USJ. In addition to the many hotel facilities, the hotel is approximate-

The city of Stirling, Scotland has been the site of many history making events - from Bannock-burn to Stirling Bridge and the towering castle that dominates the skyline; the region has hosted royal celebrations, and witnessed battles royal, including some of Scotland's most inspiring feats of courage and heroism.

Stirling's role in a significant milestone for the sport of tenpin bowling is therefore no surprise. At a specially convened Forum of representatives of Commonwealth nations participating in the inaugural Commonwealth Tenpin Bowling Championships, a momentous decision was made: the establishment of the Commonwealth Tenpin Bowling Federation.

Goals and plans were discussed, consensus was reached to establish a dedicated entity, elections were held and, in the words of WTBA President, Dato Dr. P.S. Nathan, "a sterling baby has been born". The new Federation will affiliate to the sport's international governing body, the WTBA, with its prime focus being to successfully stage biennial Commonwealth Championships that will ultimately meld into the official Commonwealth Games program.

The Executive Board, headed by Malta's Julian Pace-Bonello, was elected and preliminary work has begun to formalise the structure and operations of this important new Federation. Vice-President Peter Hutton from Scotland and Executive Board members from each of the three WTBA Zones were proposed, and ratified by the Commonwealth country representatives. Pat White from England and Sidney Tung from Malaysia were elected by their peers to represent Europe and Asia, whilst the American Zone representatives opted to consult absent Federations before electing their Zone representative. Lynne Clay from Australia was nominated and ratified as Secretary General of the new Federation.

One of the first proposals adopted by the Forum was the creation of a "Rotating" Vice-President position acknowledging the role of the Federation that will host the next Commonwealth Tenpin Bowling Championships. Mr. Roger Christofides will consequently hold this pivotal position from 2002-2004, with the next Commonwealth Tenpin Bowling Championships to be staged in Cyprus in 2004.

The success of the inaugural Commonwealth Tenpin Bowling Championship in Stirling has guaranteed the continuation of this popular international Championship. In coming weeks, the CTBF will formally announce the venue and further details of the 2004 event in Cyprus and subsequent venues for 2006 and onwards for this innovative biennial Championship.

The sport of Tenpin Bowling is one of ten popular sports named by the Australian Commonwealth Games Association this week as part of the program for the II Commonwealth Youth Games, to be held in Bendigo Victoria from 29 November to 4 December 2004.

The national governing body of the sport, Tenpin Bowling Australia, today received official notification from the ACGA that its Board has endorsed the Sports Program recommended by the Commonwealth Youth Games Organising Committee.

The sports on the program will be: - Athletics, Badminton, Boxing, Cycling, Gymnastics, Lawn Bowls, Rugby 7's, Swimming, Tenpin Bowling and Weightlifting.

"The selected sports have strong youth competitions both in Australia and in other Commonwealth countries. We are confident that this program of sports will provide an excellent opportunity for athletes from a number of Commonwealth nations to gain international competition experience in a multi-sport event through taking part in this second Commonwealth Youth Games" said ACGA President, Sam Coffa.

"There cannot be any more important element than our young athletes....we immediately put our hand up to hold this event following the first Youth Games in Edinburgh, in August 2000" he added.

Reflecting this focus on its youth athletes by Tenpin Bowling and other major sports, up to 1.000 athletes and officials are expected to participate in Bendigo in 2004 - almost double the size of the inaugural Youth Games.

Event formats for each sport will be finalised in close consultation with the Commonwealth Youth Games Organising Committee, which is currently seeking expressions of interest from all 72 Commonwealth (and/or Olympic) Games Associations (CGA's) for participation in the ten sports chosen.

The CTBF will coordinate the planning and staging of the tenpin bowling tournament in Bendigo, in conjunction with the host NSO, Tenpin Bowling Australia. Tenpin Bowling has proposed a tournament program based on two male and two female bowlers from each nation competing in a total of ten medal events (Singles, Doubles, Mixed Doubles, Teams, All Events and Masters).

"News of our sport's inclusion in this prestigious event has set the bowling world buzzing" said President of the Commonwealth Tenpin Bowling Federation, Julian Pace-Bonello from Malta today. "Our Federation was established following the Commonwealth Tenpin Bowling Championships in Scotland, with its primary focus being to stage biennial Commonwealth Championships that will ultimately meld into the official Commonwealth Games program. The announcement of our sport's inclusion in the Youth Games in Bendigo is the fulfilment of one of its goals" he said.

Some two years ago (in 2001) the Congress decided to hold the next ETBF Congress at the same time as the European Gold Cup. Poznan, Poland was the venue for the EGC 2003 and the Congress.

On 9 May 2003 at 09.00 hours, 22 delegates from the member federations had reported to the Congress room.

On a more or less normal agenda, two items were special (1) the report from Mr. Oostdam about the meetings of the FIQ restructuring committee and (2) Dato Dr. P.S. Nathan about (a) SARS in Malaysia, (b) the World Championships and (c) the Future of WTBA. Before the delegates could listen to the reports from the two gentlemen, they had to work their way through the agenda. Important changes were adopted.

An application to host an ETBF Championship has to be accompanied by an application fee of € 2.000.

The entry fee for ETBF Championships will be decided between the host and the ETBF Presidium. € 40 per participant and official has to be paid to the ETBF.

The host federation does not have to pay the expenses for the ETBF Tournament Director and for the ETBF Technical Delegate anymore.

The membership fees for the member federations remain unchanged: less than 4.000 members = \in 800 and more than 4.000 members = \in 2.200.

Our Vice President Mr. Kim Thorsgaard Jensen was for re-election and (of course) the Congress agreed. He was re-elected for a term of four years.

As you all know our dear friend Jacky Felsenstein passed away in April 2002; his place in the presidium had to be replaced. Mrs. Pat White had told the presidium that she wanted to retire. Also her position was vacant.

The Presidium elected Mr. Leo Plum from Germany and Mr. Aleksandrs Rihters from Latvia as new members of the ETBF Presidium. Welcome and we look forward to a positive and fruitful cooperation. Mr. Rune Widell and Mr. Roni Ashkenazi were re-elected.

The ETBF Presidium is hereafter composed as follows: Addie Ophelders (The Netherlands), President Kim Thorsgaard Jensen (Denmark), Vice President Rune Widell (Sweden), General Secretary Roni Ashkenazi (Israel), Presidium member Sergey Lisitsyn (Russia), Presidium member Leo Plum (Germany), Presidium member Aleksandrs Rihters (Latvia), Presidium member

FIQ restructuring: Mr. Oostdam presented a clear picture of the present situation and of the new situation (if accepted by the FIQ Congress in September 2003 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia). All member federations of ETBF present at the Congress agreed with the unanimously taken decision of the FIQ restructuring committee to adopt the ETBF proposal.

Dato Dr. P.S. Nathan, president of the WTBA had taken the time to visit our Congress and to inform the delegates about the things that keep them busy. Dr. Nathan assured all of us that we need not fear SARS in Malaysia. Also the WHO (World Health Organisation) has never declared Malaysia as a "do not visit" country.

The World Ranking Masters 2003 was held 19-23 July 2003 in Florida, USA. More specific at Kegels new established place in Lake Wales.

In the women's division a new star at the international scene was borne when the 22 year old Danish player Britt Bröndsted defeated her 23 female opponents representing countries all over the World, among them many established names in the sport.

Britt Bröndsted qualified as the 1st ranked after the 24 qualification games with a score of 5087 pins (average 211), more than 100 pins over the 2nd qualified Patricia Schwarz from Germany scoring 4968 (average 207).

Britt Bröndsted continued her top games in the top 8 three step final defeating Aumi Guerra from The Dominican Republic 2-0 (198-183 and 236-179) in the quarter final, Margalit Mizrachi from Venezuela 2-0 (221-176 and 210-158) in the Semi Final and Patricia Schwarz from Germany 2-0 (224-165 and 224-215) in the final. As presented an excellent performance by Britt Bröndsted throughout the whole tournament.

In the men's division the winner was an already established player, namely the runner up at the World Ranking Masters 2002 Anders Öhman from Sweden.

Anders Öhman qualified as 2nd after the 24 qualifying games with a pin fall of 5103 (average 212), while the 1st qualified was his later opponent in the Final Bill Hoffman from USA scoring 5170 (average 215).

Anders Öhman played 3 excellent matches in the final steps by defeating Marcos Baeza from Mexico 2-0 (238-211 and 256-225) in the quarter final, Ahmed Shaheen 2-1 (268-197, 207-236 and 213-209) in the Semi Final and Bill Hoffman 2-1 (237-223, 199-211 and 220-179) in the final.

Story 2003-39: World Championships 2003 participation

Following the development in results the last many years, a number of records at the upcoming World Championships in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia (KL) must be expected. Though already a month before the first disciplines will be conducted the first records are broken.

The total number of athletes is 628, which is a new record. The second highest number of athletes came at the World Championships 1995 in Reno, Nevada - USA where 611 athletes were present.

Both the number of female and male athletes is the highest ever. 260 participating female athletes will be on the lanes in KL, while 255 female athletes were participating at the World Championships 1999 in Abu Dhabi, UAE. In KL there will be 368 male athletes at the lanes, while 358 male athletes were participating at the World Championships 1995 in Reno.

The total number of countries participating in KL will be 66, though not a record since 67 countries was present at the World Championships 1995 in Reno.

There will probably be no doubt that the number of bowling balls to be used will be higher than ever. If for instance each player will bring 6 bowling balls to KL the total number of balls to be used can easily pass 3.500.

The total number of games to be played in KL will be 15.588 (excluding practise). In 1995 at the World Championships in Reno 15.180 games was played (excluding practise).

The Secretary General of the host federation (The Malaysian Tenpin Bowling Congress) Sidney Tung is of the opinion that a few changes in the final number of participants still might come in but that the number basically has stabilised.

Below some views from a European angle:

Players from European member federations are making up 299 of the 628 participants, which correspond to 48% of all participants. In the women division the percentage of European players is 51% and in the men division the percentage is 45%.

At the lanes in KL we will find athletes from 30 European countries - a number of European participating countries never seen higher at any international championship, including all previous conducted European Championships, where the record of participating countries are 26. The number of European athletes in KL - 299 as mentioned earlier - has never been higher before either, since 288 athletes came at the lanes at the European Championships 1997 in Nottingham, England (the until now highest number of European athletes at any previously conducted international championship).

The following federations from Europe will send athletes to the 16th World Championships 2003 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia: Armenia, Belgium, Bulgaria, Denmark, England, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Guernsey, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Jersey, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, The Netherlands, Northern Ireland, Norway, Poland, Russia, Scotland, Slovenia, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Ukraine and Wales.

The opening ceremony of the 16th World Championships 2003 will take place 9 September at the championships will continue until 20 September, ending with the women's and the men's step ladder finals in the Masters.

There will be a total of 12 medal sets to compete for in KL - 6 medal sets for each sex - in the disciplines Singles, Doubles, Trios, Team, All Event ad Masters.

The happening included two members of the press corps, namely the European Editor of Bowlers Journal Keith Hale from England and the Editor of www.bowlingdigital.com Herbert Bickel from Germany.

Both gentlemen are well known in the sport of tenpin bowling as highly estimated press officials, dedicated and with a lot of passion to the sport and often seen all over the World as soon as something important is ongoing.

They are representing each their media and as a natural part of the business they are competitors as well as colleagues and therefore normally not observed in more relaxing common activities.

One early morning during the World Ranking Masters they were however (by a hidden camera) shot together in something as extraordinary as a croquet match at a lane connected to a peaceful country side hotel situated a little outside Lake Wales.

Below you will find a few reflections to the remarkable scenery.



Divided

In the beginning they were separated and obviously having the same thought: I better be careful (very careful) staying a bit away from him, maybe he will copy my style and use it for his own benefit.

Pay attention to the stripes at the lane. They are indicating a wet lane in the dewy morning in Florida.



Maybe a bit more relaxed

After a few rounds the atmosphere was losing up and both gentlemen of the press seemed to be more relaxed.

It is interesting to observe, that they are not any longer playing at the same time, though still not in any kind of conversation.



Unified

At the end of the match they were seen in something which must be a deep and confidential conversation.

Rumours among the few spectators told, that they were unified in their view to the lane: How can that Technical Delegate make the lane like that; impossible!



I am tired of these guys

The well-known CEO of Kegel, John Davis, was appointed Technical Delegate of the match. He was obviously not satisfied with the reaction of the players and was calling for help:

"They do as usual not like the lane even it was very well prepared and made very wet for this morning squad."

During the recently years many discussions of possibilities in multiple lane conditions the Swedish coach Magnus Jonsson came up with the idea of making the two lanes at each pair of lanes different, meaning one short oil and one long oil at each pair. The concept is known as the MMP, which is a shortening of Magnus Multiple Pattern.

The MMP was tried out at the International Foundation Games Final (following the World Ranking Masters) with a successful outcome. Another reason for the phone call from John Davis, whom is known to think far ahead of most individuals, could also be: I have already lost my interest of this croquet match and instead I am concentrating on the interesting question: How do we reach the next step in the development of tenpin bowling? To dress a pair of lanes with three different conditions; it seems to be a very big challenge filled with a lot of complexity. But such a rumour could also be based on a very loose guess.

Back to the croquet match itself I would like to quote one of the competitors in the match; Keith Hale in the World Letter Plus as of 31 July)

"I very much regret to announce that in the International Media Croquet Championships, held in Lake Wales, Florida in conjunction with the World Ranking Masters and the International Foundation Games, the final standings were: England 1, Germany 6. Unfortunately, I represented England and the superbly victorious German was none other than Herbert Bickel of bowlingdigital.com. Four of the games were played on a long pattern (the grass was dry), three on short (the grass was wet). I shall find some other way of getting even in Malaysia during the WTBA World Championships; Laptops at dawn?"

Story 2003-42: After FIQ restructuring

Although it is not my task to explain to all of you in simple words what the intention of the ETBF proposal is, I take the liberty as President of the European Tenpin Bowling Federation (ETBF) to do that.

A little history

FIQ consists now of 126 member federations: 101 federations are WTBA members: the American Zone consists of 27 member federations, the Asian Bowling federation has 31 member federations and the European Tenpin Bowling Federation has 43 member federations. The WNBA has 25 member federations divided over 3 Sections: Classic, Schere and Bohle.

Already back in 1998 I presented to the FIQ Presidium my ideas of changing the organisation of FIQ. It was already then clear that the financial situation of FIQ without the help from "outside" would be very difficult.

The FIQ Presidium then decided to wait until after the Congress in 1999 (Abu Dhabi, UAE), but concluded that there was a lot of merit in the ideas.

In 2000, I presented the proposal of the ETBF Presidium again to the Presidia of FIQ, WNBA and WTBA. They all agreed to the proposal and agreed for it to be presented to the Congress in 2001.

In Aalborg, Denmark in June 2001 the FIQ Congress decided to form a committee to look into the various proposals before it and to return with the recommendations as to which to adopt. The committee to consist of 3 elected members, one from each Zone and the Presidents of FIQ, WTBA and WNBA and also 3 IOC members.

The Committee met twice: on 15 February 2002 in Salt Lake City, USA and on 13 December 2002 in Duisburg, Germany.

Result

The Committee accepted **unanimously** and **without objection** to adopt the ETBF proposal. <u>In short the ETBF proposal</u>

FIQ will **not** be dissolved, but it will be **restructured**.

There will always be a communicating liaison between WNBA/WTBA on one hand and IOC on the other hand.

The re-structured FIQ will be composed by the Presidia of WTBA (10) and WNBA (5); they will elect from themselves the new President/Chairman.

The new FIQ will **no** longer be a membership organisation; WTBA will deal with Tenpin membership and WNBA will deal with Ninepin membership.

No dues will be collected anymore by FIQ.

FIQ Congresses are NOT necessary anymore.

The new FIQ will be represented at the International level (IOC, IWGA etc.) by President WTBA, President WNBA, Secretary General and the President of the re-structured FIQ. The expenses for the re-structured FIQ will be met at 1:3 ratio; 1 for WNBA and 3 for WTBA.

IOC is informed about the re-structured organisation.

Conclusion

As one of the initiators of the proposal I must say that the Committee appointed by the Congress of FIQ in June 2001 did a very efficient job.

I sincerely hope that the FIQ Congress in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia accepts the unanimous decision of the committee.

During the recent ETBF Congress in May 2003 in Poznan, Poland, we had a presentation from Mr. B.A.M. Oostdam, member of the committee. The member federations of ETBF present were all in favour of the proposal.

I trust that the Congress in Malaysia will endorse the decision of the committee which is to adopt the ETBF proposal as summarized above.

At the WTBA Congress in September in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia it was decided to introduce a changed approval procedure for international tournaments by implementing a WTBA approval in addition to the already existing Zone approval as of 1 January 2004.

As a consequence of the changed approval procedure the following will apply for tournaments in Europe.

ETBF Approved International Tournaments

The tournaments will be open only for players whom are members of ETBF member federations. The ETBF approval fee is unchanged € 75.

WTBA Approved International Tournaments

The tournaments will be open for players from other federations than ETBF member federations. The WTBA approval fee is \in 95 in addition to the ETBF approval fee.

For tournaments not yet in the calendar as of 1 January 2004

Please use a new issue of the ETBF Tournament Application (ETBF302-002), which is available at this site under the item Publications.

For tournaments already in the calendar for 2004 and 2005

The following is only in effect if the organizer wants to achieve WTBA Approval in addition to the ETBF Approval already granted. If no such wish exists, no action is necessary.

For the pass over period, and only for tournaments already adopted in the calendar, it is not necessary to fill in a new form to receive the WTBA approval. What you need to do is to contact your federation and your federation will then notify ETBF with your wish of upgrading the tournament classification.

The additional fee of € 95 for the WTBA approval will be invoiced your federation from ETBF and, together with other fees for WTBA approvals, send to WTBA from ETBF at regular intervals.
