Maccabiah Games: A Historical Review / Page 1

The Maccabiah Games are an international Jewish multi-sport event now held quadrennial in Israel.

The Maccabiah Games is the third-largest sporting event in the world with 9.000 athletes competing on behalf of 78 countries.

The Maccabiah Games, which are organized by the Maccabi World Union, was declared a "Regional Sport Event" by, and under the auspices of and supervision of, the International Olympic Committee and international sports federations in 1960.

The Maccabiah Games are often referred to as the "Jewish Olympics".

The first Maccabiah Games was held in 1932, while the sport of bowling has been adopted as a program sport in the games in the Maccabiah Games since 1989.

Unfortunately we have not been able to locate any list of result or the names of medallists from the first bowling competitions in the games in 1989, while all other bowling results from the Maccabiah Games are available.

The format of the bowling competitions in the Maccabiah Games has from the beginning been decided to be equal to the format of the World Championships.

In each bowling competition both genders are therefore competing in Singles, Doubles, Trios, Team of Five, All Event and Masters.

Due to a lack of attending bowlers, there was no bowling competition included in the Maccabiah Games in 2017.
