Story 2002-09: Changed EGC Rules

Published on 1 March 2002 by Rune Widell

For the European Gold Cup 2002 the ETBF Presidium decided at its recently meeting by consensus to amend the rule 4.8.4 to read as follows:

The handicap used during the EGC will be based on 80% of the difference between the reported average and 180. It will be limited to 15 pins maximum.

If the average of the past season is higher than the average of the current season, the average of the past season will be used for calculation of the EGC handicap.

The handicap will be re-rated after the first 12 games of competition (doubles and the first block of singles) and will be based on 80% of the difference between the average of the 12 games and 180. It will be limited to 15 pins maximum.

It was also decided by consensus to include a new rule 4.8.6.e and f reading:

The pin fall (including handicap) will be carried forward from the first two blocks of 6 games in the singles qualification.

The pin fall from the qualification games will not be carried forward to the round robin.

The 11th ESBC was conducted in Vienna, Austria late June with a record number of not less than 800 participants at the age of 50+.

Finland was the overall successful nation by winning 13 out of 20 possible titles and in total 31 out of 60 possible medals - what a number!

In all 11 ESBC's conducted in the period 1992 - 2002 Finland has in each occasion been the country winning most medals, but never as dominating as this year in Vienna. Probably it will be a record very difficult to beat.

Among the Finnish successors was legendary Eija Krogerus whom won the Masters in Women's group C and the Doubles in Women's group C together with Seija Nurmi. Eija Krogerus took her first international titles at the European Championships 1962 in Besancon, France by winning gold medals in Women's Doubles, Women's Four Team European style and Women's Four Team American style.

Eija Krogerus is one of the most winning bowlers ever and still going very strong participating in the ESBC age group C, which is bowlers of the age 67+. In the 6 games Masters Final of group C the score of Eija Krogerus was 1144 and Eija Krogerus won the ESBC 2002 Masters with an edge of 125 pins down to the silver medallist in the 24 games masters.

The 17th European Cup Teams was conducted in German Mülheim 28 June - 7 July 2002 with a record number of 42 participating teams (16 female teams and 26 male teams). For the first time in the history of the ECT teams from Bulgaria and Belarus was participating.

After 5 days of country versus country matches (240 matches in the women division and 650 matches in the men division) 3 women and 3 men team were ready for the finals to be conducted Saturday 6 July.

Women's Final

The first match in the women's final was won by the team from Finland scoring 399 against the team from England scoring 372. The team from Finland continued to the final match against host nation Germany and after a very tight match decided in the very last frames the team from Finland came out as the winner with a score of 382 pins against the pin fall of 366 for the German team.

ECT 2002 medals in the women's division

Gold: Finland Silver: Germany Bronze: England

Winning the ECT 2002 the team from Finland won their fourth ECT gold medal in a row - a very unique and extraordinary series never seen before in the history of the European Cup Teams. Heidi Larnia from Finland has been on the team in all four occasions and being an ECT gold medallist in 1996, 1998, 2000 and 2002 Heidi Larnia indeed deserves to be named the Queen of the ECT.

Men's Final

Throughout nearly the whole tournament, the team from Norway was in the leading position of the 26 team large male field of the ECT 2002. But only a few matches before the end of the qualification the team from Sweden took over the leading position, meaning that the team from Norway should be up against the team from Finland in the first match in the men's final.

Anyhow the team from Norway continued their excellent performance in the ECT 2002 by winning the first match against Finland 411-377 and the final match against Sweden 439-337. The shining team of the ECT 2002 Men's Division indeed was Norway, which took their first ECT medal ever and by that of course also their first ECT gold medal ever. At the team of Norway was Tore Torgersen (the reigning All Event World Champion) and Kim Asbjörn Haugen (the reigning AMF World Cup Champion).

The 16th European Youth Championships held in Rome 19-28 July 2002 is concluded. The championships did in many ways break barriers and pointed at a future where more federations will take part in the competition of medals - later on as the adult level as well.

A new record of participants was achieved with 19 participating countries and 189 participants (84 girls and 105 boys).

Austria took their first gold medal in a youth championship ever by winning the Boys Team event.

Russia took their first medal ever in an elite event (youth and adult) by the silver medal won by Alexandre Silnitchenko in the Boy's Masters.

The girl's team from England was dominating the girls division by winning 4 out of 5 possible gold medals and in addition 3 silver medals and 2 bronze medals.

In the Girls All Event and in the Girls Masters all three medals was won by the English girls and their domination of the 16th EYC was furthermore proven in the Girls Masters by English girls at the 5th and 6th position in addition to the three medals in the discipline.

As always the EYC 2002 was held in a great atmosphere - in between a kind of European song contest for youth bowlers and their supporters - an atmosphere very special for youth championships.

In the first one game match in the Girls Masters Shannon Pluhowsky defeated Korean Ho-Jung Kim 213 vs. 193 and in the final two games match Shannon Pluhowsky came out as the winner again defeating Korean Soo-Yeon Hong 429 (213+216) vs. 390 (212-178).

In the first one game match in the Boys Masters Wu-Siu Hong from Hong Kong defeated Martin Larsen from Sweden 261-191 and Wu-Siu Hong continued his excellent performance by winning the final two games match against Korean Ko-Woon Kim 431 (194+237) vs. 401 (179+222).

Story 2002-41: WTBA Presidium meeting

On 22 and 23 October 2002, the Presidium of the WTBA met in Riga, Latvia for their meeting. On de days prior this meeting and on the day after this meeting various committee meetings were held.

Kim Thorsgaard Jensen participated in the meeting of the Tournament Committee and I participated two days in the meeting of the Rules Committee. Rune Widell participated in the meetings of the Rules Committee, the Tournament Committee and the Technical Committee. The three committees had delivered their reports to the WTBA Presidium so they had a chance to look at the proposals and take decisions where necessary.

- The Rules Committee is working on the procedure how to incorporate WTBA. The Statutes need to be changed into: a. MEMORANDUM of ASSOCIATION AND b. ARTICLES of ASSOCIATION. All other documents (Playing Rules, Tournament Organizers Manual, Doping Manual, Contract and/or agreements) will be put in so called BY-LAWS. The Committee is progressing very well and hopes to have their proposals ready to be approved by the WTBA Presidium in March 2003. The proposals will then be sent to the member federations for study and final approval during the Congress of WTBA in September 2003 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.
- The Tournament Committee is still working on a new format for the World Championships. It is the idea of the Committee to send their proposals to the member federations BEFORE they are presented to the Congress of WTBA. The new format will NOT be effective before 2004.
- (3) The Technical Committee came after almost two years of study with proposals to the WTBA Committee for their approval. You can find hereunder the proposals that are accepted and thus approved by the WTBA Presidium; I will also list the effective date.
- Effective 1 January 2003, the MULTI LANE DRESSING rule will be in force. The committee proposed two (2) ways of dressing the lanes: SHORT, between 28 and 32 feet and LONG, between 40 and 44 feet. The difference between the two methods should not be less than ten (10) feet. The guideline for the ratio of applying oil will be 1: 2, 5 (crosswise) and always "tapered" (lengthwise). The "5 units of oil" rule will be deleted: in other words, does not exist anymore. The Multi Lane Dressing rule will NOT be used during the WTTC. Only during the World Championships and during the World Youth Championships the new dressing rule will be used. During the next World Championships in 2003 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, the Multi Lane Dressing method however, will NOT BE USED. The new dressing method is only possible if we change the format of the WC; in KL, Malaysia we will bowl according the format that still exists. The WTBA Tournament Committee is working on a new format for the WC, but until that is approved by the WTBA Presidium and the WTBA Congress, it is not effective yet. All of the above is OPTIONAL for the Zones and for International Tournaments.
- (5) During WTBA and ZONE Championships, effective 1 January 2003, six (6) bowling balls per player may be used. The player is allowed to bring as many bowling balls to the competition as he/she wants, but immediately AFTER the official practise, he/she has to make a selection of which bowling balls will be used. The WTBA/ZONE Tournament Technical Committee is the only authority that can allow replacement(s) in case of unforeseen circumstances.
- (6)
 Lane Conditions set for a Championship (WTBA and/or ZONE) may only be "fine-tuned" by the WTBA/ZONE Technical Delegate PRIOR to the Official Practise. Information about changes will

be given during the Managers-meeting.

(7)

Effective 1 January 2003 only the bowling balls mentioned on the list, which can be found at: www.bowl.com may be used. The so-called "60 day plus" rule is deleted. In other words the bowling balls mentioned on that list (regardless their approval date) shall be used during WTBA and ZONE Championships.

(8)

From 1 January 2003 until 1 January 2005 a two-year trial period will be used for Bowling ball check. During WTBA and ZONE Championships only RANDOM checks will be held. Every day, bowling balls of the medallists and "random" players will be inspected. Penalties for playing with bowling-balls that do not meet specifications are: medals taken away or, in case of Master Finals, the player will be taken out of competition.

(9)

Altering the surface of the bowling ball

During the INITIAL OFFICIAL PRACTISE, players are allowed to change the whole surface of the bowling balls that they will be using during the championships. This rule will also be effective as of 1 January 2003 and applies to WTBA and ZONE Championships.

(10)

The WTBA Presidium had already in 1999, during the Congress in Abu Dhabi, announced that a proposal to raise the membership fees could be expected. In 2001 during the Congress in Aalborg, Denmark the Presidium did not present a proposal, but during the Congress of 2003 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, a proposal to raise the membership fee will be presented. Details of the proposal will be published later, but a raise of 30 % can be expected. It will be ten (10) years ago that the membership fee was raised.

To lower the costs for hosts of WTBA (and Zone) Championships, a new system will be introduced: Entry fees for championships will go up and an additional fee for WTBA will be raised. A Congress fee will be raised for those participating in Congresses. The Victory Banquette will be OPTIONAL.

(11)

The World Championships 2003 will be held in two (2) bowling centres: Men will bowl in 48 AMF wood lane centre PYRAMID MEGA lanes and the Ladies will bowl in the 32 AMF synthetic lane centre AMPANG SUPERBOWL. This centre is ten minutes away from PYRAMID. The first bulletin will be published very soon.

The Team managers meeting and the Opening Ceremony are planned to be on 9 September 2003. Official practise is on 10 and 11 September 2003; Competition starts on 12 September and ends with Stepladder final and Victory Banquette on 20 September 2003. The competition for ladies might be a little shorter.

The 11th and last stop in the European Bowling Tour 2002, Kungsbacka International Tournament 2002, was concluded earlier today.

By the conclusion of the tour the European Tenpin Bowling Federation is able to announce the EBT 2002 winners, which formally took place at the end of the tournament in Kungsbacka at a short ceremony held at the end of the tournament.

Each of the winners Bettina Lund from Denmark in the women's division and Gery Verbruggen from Belgium in the men's division (presented at the picture above) was awarded a prize of 2.000 Euro.

Bettina Lund won the women's division in a very sovereign way with a total of 179 points before Tanya Petty from Germany with 65 points at the second position and Kirsten Penny from England with 64 points at the third position. Bettina Lund was third ranked in Europe in 2000 and first ranked in Europe in 2001.

Also Gery Verbruggen won the men's division in a convincing way with 111 points before Anders Öhman from Sweden with 79 points at the second position and Mika Luoto from Finland with 68 points at the third position. Gery Verbruggen was first ranked in Europe both in 2000 and in 2001 as well.
