# Story 2009-01: EBT 2009-01

For the 10th time, in just as many possibilities, the European Bowling Tour took off in fantastic Tali Bowling Centre in Helsinki - Finland, where Brunswick Ballmaster Open was conducted for the 39th consecutive time.

The always very well organized tournament in Tali was attended by 382 players and not less than 825 entries were played.

The tournament has not had a non-Finnish winner since 1996 (Tore Torgersen from Norway) and 2009 became no exception.

For the third time in his career, Brunswick Ballmaster Open became a highlight for Pasi Uotila from Finland, who defeated England's Dominic Barrett 214-212 in a very exiting final. In the Semi Finals, Pasi Uotila defeated Dennis Eklund from Sweden 184-168, while Dominic Barrett defeated the organizer Kimmo Lehtonen 223-204.

Nicole Sanders from The Netherlands played a very good tournament against the many (not least Finnish) male players and she was even very close to reach the Semi Finals after a very close 2-3 match against Kimmo Lehtonen in the best of 5 games quarter final.

Obviously Nicole Sanders begins the tour season at position 1 in the women's ranking, followed by Patricia Luoto from Germany and Krista Pöllänen from Finland at the next positions.

# Story 2009-07: EBT 2010 applications

The ETBF Presidium has opened for applications from organizers, who want their tournaments adopted in the European Bowling Tour 2010.

The ultimate deadline for organizers to apply is Friday 19 June 2009. Shortly after the deadline, the composition of the EBT 2010 will be published.

As of the EBT 2010, it will be easier for new organizers to join the tour, since a new category named EBT Satellites, with a minimum prize pool op 20.000 €, is introduced. In addition the previous category names, EBT Challenger, EBT Major and EBT Premier, will change to EBT Silver, EBT Gold and EBT Platinum.

The details of the categories are presented below.

Definitions in use in the category presentations:

#### Entry Value:

Sometimes the entry value is misunderstood as the entry fee, but it's not. The entry value is a ratio used to evaluate the interrelation between the size of the prize fund and the entry fee. It is calculated as the total prize fund divided with the maximum primary entry fee.

#### Prize fund:

All prize money allocated for individual players in the international part of the tournament.

<u>Clash:</u>

A tournament, ending in for instance the same weekend when another tournament is beginning its first squads, is an overlap and not a clash.

#### **EBT Satellite Tournaments**

The prize fund must be minimum € 20.000

The entry value must be minimum 150

An EBT Satellite Tournament cannot clash with tournaments in any of the other categories EBT Satellite Tournaments can clash with each other, but normally only if they are scheduled with a suitable geographical distance and in each case after careful and complete investigations carried out by the ETBF Tournament Committee.

The ranking point table will be in use with a factor 1 The organizers' EBT Fee will be  $\in$  1.500

#### **EBT Silver Tournaments**

The prize fund must be minimum  $\in$  40.000 The entry value must be minimum 225 An EBT Silver Tournament cannot clash with any other EBT Tournaments The ranking point table will be in use with a factor 2 The organizers' EBT Fee will be  $\in$  2.500

#### **EBT Gold Tournaments**

The prize fund must be minimum € 60.000

The entry value must be minimum 325 An EBT Gold Tournament cannot clash with any other EBT Tournaments The ranking point table will be in use with a factor 3 The organizers' EBT Fee will be  $\in$  4.000

#### **EBT Platinum Tournaments**

The prize fund must be minimum  $\in$  100.000 The entry value must be minimum 500 An EBT Platinum Tournament cannot clash with any other EBT Tournaments The ranking point table will be in use with a factor 5 The organizers' EBT Fee will be  $\in$  5.000

A tournament can enter for the first time in the tour only in the categories EBT Satellite or EBT Silver.

To achieve the EBT Gold or the EBT Platinum status, the tournament must have been adopted at least once in a previous EBT.

There will be a maximum of 3 tournaments from a federation in total for the categories EBT Platinum, EBT Gold and EBT Silver.

There is in principle no limit of the number of EBT Satellites from the same federation in the tour, but the number will, with considerations for the general tour calendar, be regulated by the ETBF Presidium from year to year.

The ETBF Presidium has decided to accept an offer from Borut Knavs, the Technical Manager of Bowling Centre Gladiator in Ljubljana (Slovenia) and the organizer of the annual stop in the European Bowling Tour, the QubicaAMF Open, to organize the EBT Masters 2011.

The EBT Masters 2011 will be conducted in Bowling Centre Gladiator, most probably in April 2011, following the conduction of the 5th QubicaAMF Open 2011, which final dates will be decided latest early 2010.

#### Story 2009-09: EBT 2009-02

Osku Palermaa, the tour winner in 2007 and 2008, took the lead of the EBT 2009 already after two stops, when he won the Hammer Bronzen Schietspoel Tournament 2009, concluded in Tilburg, The Netherlands a few days ago. It was Palermaa's 8th tour stop victory in his career.

The victory became a reality after Palermaa won the concluding 4 persons pool, where he scored 467 over the two games vs. the score of 442 to Peter Smits from The Netherlands at position 3, the score of 436 to Mads Sandbäkken from Norway at position 3 and the score of 419 to Tobias Karlsson from Sweden at position 4.

In the tour standing, Palermaa is topping the ranking with 150 points, followed by Dominic Barrett from England at position 2 with 130 points and Dennis Eklund from Sweden at position 3 with 108 points.

The highest ranked women in Tilburg became Ghislaine van der Tol from The Netherlands; who became the highest ranked for the 5th time in her career.

The women's division is for the second stop in a row led by Nicole Sanders from The Netherlands, after the tournament in Tilburg with 142 points, followed by Ghislaine van der Tol at position 2 with her 100 points won in Tilburg and at a tied position 3 with 80 points, Nicki Ainge from England and Patricia Luoto from Germany.

## Story 2009-10: EBT 2009-03

Lucas Legnani from Argentina became the first player from his country to win a stop in the European Bowling Tour, when he won the EBT 2009 Stop 03, the VII Catalonia Open - Trofeu Galasa in Barcelona.

The victory brings Lucas Legnani into a very small exclusive club of only 9 non-European players having won each one tour stop out of the 135 tour stops played so far since 2000. The other non-European stop winners are Tim Mack USA), Peter Weber (USA), Michael Fagan (USA), Brian Voss (USA), Bill Hoffman (USA), Remy Ong (Singapore), Wu Siu Hong (Hong Kong) and Jason Belmonte (Australia).

In the one game final Lucas Legnani scored 211 against 205 for England's Dominic Barrett, who for his sake took the lead of the tour with 210 points in front of Osku Palermaa from Finland at position 2 with 200 points (50 points in Barcelona) and Dennis Eklund from Sweden at position 3 with 132 Points (24 points in Barcelona).

It will be interesting to follow the two young players in the top of the tour, if they will play as many tour stops this year as they usually does. It could be a very tight top fight.

In the women's division Kirsten Penny became the highest ranked women for the 12 time in a tour stop ever, and it leaves her alone at the never ending list of highest ranked followed by the two Danes, Britt Bröndsted with 11 highest ranked positions and Bettina Lund with 10 highest ranked positions.

Without attending the tournament in Barcelona, Nicole Sanders from The Netherlands kept her leading position with 142 points, closely followed by the two Finns, Krista Pöllänen at position 2 with 140 points (70 points in Barcelona) and Piritta Kantola at position 3 with 128 points (80 points in Barcelona).

# Story 2009-11: Name change in Lahti

# Story 2009-12: EBT 2009-04

The 6th issue of the Brunswick Euro Challenge was conducted in the French city St. Maximin (situated just outside Paris) on 6-13 March. The tournament was conducted in the Valcke owned centre, Le Plaza Bowling, for the second time in a row, while the tournament was conducted in Thessaloniki, Greece in its first four issues.

The final of the tournament became an internal PBA affair, where Mike Fagan from USA defeated his fellow countryman, the PBA veteran Brian Voss, 236-225 in the one game final.

The first match in the stepladder final was an internal Danish woman affair, where Mai Ginge Jensen defeated Kamilla Kjeldsen 210 - 190. In the second match Mai Ginge Jensen was defeated by Mike Fagan 214 - 218.

In the women's ranking of the tour, the 100 points awarded to Mai Ginge Jensen took her to a shared leading position with a 170 points total, together with Patricia Luoto from Germany, who was awarded 60 points in St. Maximin. At position 3 is the previous tour leader, Nicole Sanders from The Netherlands with 158 points (16 points in St. Maximin).

In the men's ranking, Osku Palermaa from Finland, although only awarded 12 points in St. Maximin, took back the leading position with 212 points from England's Dominic Barrett, who unfortunately was injured shortly before the tournament in St. Maximin and whom has excused also from the next tour stop in Istanbul. Dominic Barret has 210 points at position 3, while Danish Jesper Agerbo climbed to position 3 and 148 points, after being awarded 50 points in St. Maximin.

# Story 2009-13: Agreement PBA-ETBF

The Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) and the European Tenpin Bowling Federation (ETBF) recently met and agreed to explore areas of common interest for both the short term and over the coming years.

We are indeed in the early stages of our considerations, but we are pleased to present the first visible step, which is establishing a link between the newly created PBA World Series of Bowling and the European Bowling Tour.

The link is established by qualifying one EBT player into the field of 72 bowlers during the five exempt tournaments in the World Series of Bowling. There are two more tournaments in the series (both open), which brings the total number to seven tournaments.

In order to give the highest ranked EBT player sufficient time to prepare for this exciting opportunity, the internal EBT competition for this exempt spot will be limited to the first seven stops on the EBT 2009.

The EBT player winning this spot will be the highest ranked player in the men's division of the European Bowling Tour after the Brunswick Aalborg International. If the highest ranked player declines this opportunity, the spot will be awarded to the 2nd ranked man etc.

There will be 3 international exemptions available in the field of 72 for the 5 exempt tournaments. EBT players, who don't earn the one spot guaranteed to the EBT through the agreement with PBA, but are interested in bowling in the World Series of Bowling, may apply directly to PBA for consideration for the other 2 spots. Information regarding this process will be made available at <u>www.pba.com</u>.

The finals for tournaments in the World Series of Bowling will take place from 5-7 September and will be shown on ESPN on a tape delayed basis.

The two tournaments marked with blue text are open tournaments, where any bowler can enter. The five other tournaments are the exempt tournaments. However, any EBT player, be-

sides the player qualified directly from the EBT, will also have a chance to participate since there will be 11 Tournament Qualifying Round entries for each of the 5 exempt tournaments.

In addition to the 7 tournaments conducted as part of the World Series of Bowling, there will be side events such as sweepers conducted on a regular basis during the series. All entry fees in these side events will go directly to prize funds, without any charge for lineage or administration.

The PBA World Series of Bowling in Detroit was created so players can play in a series of top events, while keeping travel expenses to a minimum. The period of the World Series of Bowling fits perfectly with the break in the EBT schedule.

For the five exempt tournaments, the entry fee for non-PBA members is \$ 325 (\$ 350 if paid on the day of the tournament) per Tournament Qualifying Round, while the entry fee for each of the two open tournaments is \$ 600. If you are a PBA member, there is an entry fee reduction of \$ 25 for each of the Tournament Qualifying Rounds and \$ 100 for each of the opens.

The total prize fund for each of the five exempt tournaments is \$ 192.600 (\$ 25.000 first prize) and exempt players are guaranteed a minimum payment of \$ 1.400. The total prize funds for the two open tournaments still are to be published, but we can quote www.pba.com as follows:

The inaugural series, which begins 2 August and runs through 7 September 2009, promises to be a revolutionary festival of competitive bowling boasting a \$ 2 million prize fund and seven ESPN telecasts.

We agree in ETBF that PBA's World Series of Bowling is going to be an exciting and attractive series of tournaments to go for in Detroit in August-September 2009.

As a part of the Educational Programs and Certification Programs, the ETBF Presidium decided to give accreditation to Bowling Training Centres, who are helping to develop our sport and provide high standards of Bowling Education.



Kuortane Bowling Training and Education Centre in Finland became the first "ETBF Approved Bowling Training Centre" and their certificate is presented during EYC 2009 in Malmo by Onder Gurkan, Chairman of the ETBF Educational Committee and Jack Groenenberg, ETBF instructor to Piritta Kantola, well known Finnish National Team Member and Coach and who is the director of the Training Centre.

Located in Kuortane High Performance Olympic Training Cen-

tre, the training facility not only provides 6 lanes dedicated for education equipped with digital analysis systems but also classrooms, exercise facilities, accommodation and of course high performance sports education support for bowlers since 2005.

Gurkan says; "ETBF gives utmost importance to high level Bowling Training Centres as they are the main resources for our development. Kuortane is very important for us at that stage. It is not only their students they educated but the researches they made, the information they share is improving all of our knowledge. Locating a bowling training centre in an Olympic Training facility shows how bowling taken seriously in Finland.

ETBF Educational Committee is cooperating with Kuortane to improve our educational programs to a higher state which is equipped with high level of sports information. We are planning to use that great facility as an Official Education/Development Centre for our future central coaching clinics. We are working on Coaching Development Workshops in the future to provide latest information, research and developments in bowling world."

The evaluation process for approved bowling training centres is based on three major fields:

- 1. The facility includes the evaluation of the dedicated lanes for training centre, the condition of the lanes, lane machines, digital analysis hardware and software, classrooms and presentation opportunities. Extra possibilities within or around the centre such as fitness centres, leisure time facilities, food and accommodation options are seen as additional values for such a facility.
- 2. The coaches should have good level of bowling sports education and experience.
- 3. The facility should follow a defined educational program that has been approved by ETBF to provide consistency and high level of information.

The ETBF Presidium believes that supporting those facilities is utmost importance to develop our sport to higher levels. Bowling Training Centres are accepted as rare valuable assets because they are only dedicated for bowling education.

The 22<sup>nd</sup> European Youth Championships, conducted in Baltiska Hallen in Malmoe - Sweden, was concluded on 12 April 2009 with an overall sportive success for the team from the host federation.

Not least the 4 Swedish girls proved that they bowled in a separate category in these championships, while they took 3 out of 5 Gold medals (Singles, Doubles and All Event). Finland won the Girl's Team event and finally Netherlands, by Carmen Haandrikman (the all event gold medallists from 2008), won the prestigious Masters title.

In the Boy's Division, the gold medals was divided between 5 countries, since Latvia won the Gold medal in Singles, England won the Gold medal in Doubles, Greece won the Gold medal in Team, Denmark won the Gold medal in All Event, while the boys prestigious Masters title was won by Sweden's Mattias Jansson.

If anyone is finding the name Jansson familiar, we can confirm the relation. Raymond Jansson, one of the biggest names in Swedish bowling over a couple of decades, is the proud father of Mattias Jansson.

One player won 5 medals (which is a medal in each discipline), namely:

Elin Adolfsson from Sweden in the girl's division: Gold in Doubles, Gold in All Event, Silver in Masters, Bronze in Team and Bronze in Singles

Two players won 4 medals each, namely:

Arturs Livikins from Latvia in the boy's division: Gold in Singles, Silver in Masters, Silver in All Event and Bronze in Team

Mik Stampe from Denmark in the Boy's Division: Gold I All Event, Silver in Singles, Bronze in Doubles and Bronze in Team.

The new format with 4 girls and 4 boys in the teams, and including Singles, Doubles, Team, All Events and Maters as the five events for both genders, was played for the first time in Malmoe after it was decided at the ETBF Congress in 2007.

The number of players entering was as much as 76 girls and 108 boys, 184 players in total, which proves that the reduced number of team members and the changed format was a necessity to handle future issues of the EYC.

The World Ranking Masters 2009, which is a common tournament for the top 8 women and the top 8 men of the 2008 zone rankings for the Pan American Bowling Confederation, the Asian Bowling Federation and the European Tenpin Bowling Federation, was conducted in Naples, Italy on 27 April - 3 May 2009.

After the final in the men's division, which were won by Finland's Osku Palermaa 2-0, Palermaa is allowed to name him selves King of the Masters, since he also won the first EBT Masters (the final of the European Bowling Tour), which were conducted in Ankara in September 2008.

Palermaa won the final against his fellow club made Tore Torgersen from Norway after a very well-played match, where the game scores became as high as 159 vs. 234 and 248 vs. 238.

In the men's Semi Finals, Palermaa defeated Robert Andersson from Sweden 2-1 (158-198, 223-204 and 213-206), while Tore Torgersen defeated Stuart Williams from England 2-1 (179-280, 223-187 and 244-204).

Siti Safiyah Amirah from Malaysia became the Queen of the WRM, while she defeated Germany's Tina Hulsch 2-0 (215-199 and 175-166) in the final.

In the Semi Finals Siti Safiyah Amirah continued after a 2-1 game win (192-188, 215-277 and 213-174) over Ghislaine van der Tol from The Netherlands, while Tina Hulsch defeated the other Dutch Semi Finalist, Wendy Kok, by 2-1 as well (213-193, 190-200 and 246-195).

The WRM 2009 became a great success for the European player's, who took not less than 7 out of 8 positions in all four Semi Finals.

This was, as far as we are informed, the last WRM ever to be conducted.

# Story 2009-23: Ballmaster shines Platinum

The European Bowling Tour 2010 is not yet composed, but the composition period is in progress until 19 June and a number of applications for tournaments to be adopted in the EBT 2010 are received by ETBF in these weeks.

Today we received yet another application and what a fantastic kind of an application it was.

Brunswick Ballmaster Open, the longest lasting international tournament in Europe with an unbroken number of annual conductions, and the only tournament in the tour programme every year since the very beginning of the European Bowling Tour in 2000, celebrates its 40 years jubilee in 2010 and has decided to do the celebration with an extraordinary firework over bowling Helsinki.

The organization of Ballmaster was taken over by the well-known business man and excellent bowler, Kimmo Lehtonen, for some years ago, and his entrance on the scene brought new vitality, power and not least life back to this tournament, which is so rich of traditions.

Since 2004, where the prize fund of the tournament jumped to modern heights, the prize pool has constantly increased from  $50.000 \in$  to the  $75.000 \in$ , which was awarded this year. Despite this development, the prize pool increases to historical  $105.000 \in$  in 2010 and at the same moment Lehtonen announces a return to the roots for the final of the tournament, which will present a hyper classic 16 players Round Robin followed by a stepladder final.

We "caught" Kimmo Lehtonen in Helsinki for a few remarks to this fantastic jubilee issue of Ballmaster, and we asked him, among other things, about the reason for this initiative:

"I do not really know, I just am like this and I have always been like this", said Kimmo Lehtonen (41), while he was considering the reasons for this enormous level of prize money in the tournament.

"I think that Ballmaster Open deserves this, and time is right when the tournament reaches its 40 years jubilee. Furthermore, when the situation in the World is as it is right now, we just have to have courage to do something big and to do it together", said Lehtonen.

The winner of Brunswick Ballmaster Open 2010 will cash not less than  $15.000 \in$ . That is important to Kimmo Lehtonen, but even more important is that the lowest prizes, for the last positioned players in the 48 players final field, will be as high as  $1.500 \in$ . "It means a lot to me that also the last positioned finalists will get a good prize. I wish that many players from many different countries will come to Tali and together with us built and share the atmosphere of the 40th Ballmaster Open. We welcome bowlers from all levels to the 40th Brunswick Ballmaster Open", said Lehtonen

Finally Lehtonen ended with the following important view for our sport: "All of us, bowlers, organizers and people working with bowling, must work for the sport of bowling. Let's try to make tournaments, which are re-establishing respect for our sport!"

The  $105.000 \in$  prize pool brings the tournament to the highest of the four categories in the European Bowling Tour, the EBT Platinum, which, among other characteristics, will ensure that all ranking points awarded in the tournament will be multiplied by a factor 5.

The top four battles in the Brunswick Aalborg International 2009 nearly became an internal Team Pergamon affair, with Osku Palermaa (Finland), Tore Torgersen (Norway) and Martin Larsen (Sweden) in the Semi Finals together with Joonas Jähi from Finland.

At the end of the battle, Martin Larsen stood back with his first victory in Aalborg after a 457 - 449 win over his fellow Pergamon club made, Tore Torgersen, in the two games final in Lov-vang Bowling Centre.

In the foregoing Semi Finals, Martin Larsen defeated Joonas Jähi 472 - 424, while Tore Torgersen defeated Osku Palermaa 458 - 432.

Osku Palermaa stayed atop of the men's division in the European Bowling Tour with 322 points (60 points in Aalborg) followed by Dominic Barrett from England with 252 points (42 points in Aalborg) and Martin Larsen from Sweden with 238 points (100 points in Aalborg) at the following positions.

Krista Pöllänen from Finland became the highest ranked woman in Aalborg after she concluded her participation with a position 6 in the tournament, only 37 points away from one of the Semi Final spots.

New in the lead of the women's division of the European Bowling Tour, with a point total of 250, is Denmark's Mai Ginge Jensen, who was awarded 80 points in Aalborg for being the second highest ranked woman at position 11. Mai Ginge Jensen is followed by Nina Flack from Sweden with 244 points (40 points in Aalborg) and Krista Pöllänen from Finland with 240 points (100 points in Aalborg) at the next positions.

Late March this year we was with excitement introducing the first visible outcome of a beginning co-operation between PBA and the EBT in form of an exempt spot in the PBA World Series of Bowling for the highest ranked positioned player after 7 stops in the men's division of the EBT 2009. Without doubt this spots was expected to go to, and it went to, Finland's Osku Palermaa, the last two years king of the men's division of the tour.

#### Story 2009-25: EMC 2009

After a dramatic final in the Masters event, England's Dominic Barrett was crowned as the 14th European Masters Champion since Tauno Niemeinen from Finland became the first champion for 47 years ago in Besancon, France 1962.

Until the 8th frame in the second game, it looked like a clear win for Dominic Barrett's opponent, Petter Hansen from Norway, who was leading 1-0 (174 - 153) and whom had a comfortable lead in the second game.

Anyway, when Petter Hansen shot a 4 split followed by only one pin in the 8th frame (after two strikes in frame 6 and 7), it opened the door that much for Dominic Barrett, that he after a good finish suddenly found him selves back in the match after a second game win of 204 vs. 187. Dominic Barrett never looked back from that moment on, and he won the title after an outstanding performance (269 vs. 185) in game 3.

It is obvious for all that many more titles in championships and tour stops will be in front of the young, talented and very ambitious young player, who became the first Englishman to claim the Masters title.

The other 4 titles were divided between Finland (gold in Doubles and Team), Sweden (gold in Trios) and Norway (gold in All Event).

Dominic Barrett took medals in all 5 disciplines, namely bronze in Doubles, bronze in Trios, bronze in Team, silver in All Event and finally the gold medal in the Masters event.

His opponent in the Masters final, Petter Hansen, took four medals, namely bronze in Doubles, silver in Trios, gold in All Event and silver in Masters.

The team event became an emotional good by for Finland's legendary Kimmo Lehtonen, who declared the EMC 2009 in Aalborg to be his last European Championships. And what a career; Lehtonen begun a long journey by winning a gold medal in the Team event in 1985 and concluded the journey 22 years later by winning a gold medal in the team event again.

It is a pleasure for the ETBF Presidium to present the 11th edition of the European Bowling Tour (The EBT 2010), including 21 stops as presented in the EBT 2010 Calendar at this site.

It is in many ways a tour introducing a lot of different news.

For the first time we are introducing 4 different categories in the tour and for the first time we are using the category names EBT Platinum (1 tournament in 2010), EBT Gold (7 tournaments in 2010), EBT Silver (9 tournaments in 2010) and EBT Satellite (4 tournaments in 2010).

The tour takes off early January with a firework of a Platinum Tournament in Helsinki, where rich of tradition Brunswick Ballmaster Open celebrates its 40 years jubilee, with for the very first time in the history of the tournament to present a prize pool higher than 100.000 Euro.

Six tournaments is included in the tour for the first time, namely the IV International Wroclaw Open in Poland (Satellite), the 1st Austria Challenge in Austria (Silver), the 1st Dream Bowl Palace Open in Germany (Silver), BNC Bratislava Open in Slovakia (Silver), the 1st Torneo Internazionale di Roma in Italy (Satellite) and the 1st Pavlovskiy Posad Open in Russia (Satellite).

For the first time a tour stop will be conducted in Poland, Slovakia and Russia.

The total prize fund (including tour prize money) in the EBT 2010 will be approximately 1.2 million  $\in$ , with an average prize fund of approximately 55.000  $\in$  per stop.

It is in many ways a stormy period in the world economy, just like many domestic economies are facing numerous local challenges. In such a situation it has been fantastic to meet the many wishes to take part and to contribute to keep the EBT not only alive, but still dynamic and vital. We are very grateful to the many organizers, who are taking the risk and whom are showing their strong dedication to our sport. We hope all organizers and their tournaments will be well supported by players, federations, sponsors and media.

The 16 highest ranked women and the 16 highest ranked men by the conclusion of the EBT 2010 will qualify for the 4th EBT Masters 2011, which will be hosted by the organizer of the 5th Qubica/AMF Open 2011 in Ljubljana, most likely in April 2011.

The final of the ongoing EBT 2009, the 3rd EBT masters 2010, will be hosted by the organizer of the 1st Austria Challenge in Vienna on 3-4 May 2010.

It became a very memorable meeting in the final, when the 4 times tour winner (2000-2003) Gery Verbruggen from Belgium met the 3 times tour winner (2004-2006) Paul Moor from England over 2 games. At the end Moor took the victory with 426 pins against the 395 pins knocked down by Verbruggen.

Another interesting aspect with the Verbruggen-Moor meeting is that the two players was sharing the position of being the most winning player in the tour ever (10 titles each since 2000), a position Moor obviously keeps alone with 11 titles after his win in San Marino.

In the men's division of the EBT 2009, Osku Palermaa from Finland kept his leading position with 334 points (12 points in San Marino), while Dominic Barrett from England with 282 points (30 points in San Marino) and Martin Larsen from Sweden with 264 points (26 points in San Marino) takes the two following positions.

The leader of the women's division of the EBT 2009 changed again; this time with the winner of the EBT 2008, Nina Flack from Sweden (70 points in San Marino), at the top position.

Nina Flack has with a total of 314 points after half of the stops in 2009, a comfortable distance of 64 and 69 points to the nearest competitors, Mai Ginge Jensen from Denmark with 250 points (no participation in San Marino) and Nicole Sanders from The Netherlands (40 points in San Marino). ## Story 2009-38: Updated ETBF Constitution

Published on 28 August 2009 by Kim Thorsgaard Jensen

The ETBF Constitution is updated according to decisions made at the ETBF Congress in June and a few changes derived from decisions made at the WTBA Congress early August.

The following main changes are included:

#### **Quorum at ETBF Congresses**

The quorum has been changed from at least half of the member federations (including proxies) to at least one third of the member federations (including proxies).

#### Fees

The annual ETBF membership fee for federations having less than 4.000 members is changed from  $\in$  800 to  $\in$  880.

The annual ETBF membership fee for federations having 4.000 or more members is changed from  $\in$  2.400 to  $\in$  2.640.

The champion fee for ETBF is changed from  $\in$  50 per member of the delegation to  $\in$  60 per member of the delegation.

The fee for congress delegates is changed from  $\in$  25 for the voting delegate and  $\in$  50 for each additional delegate to  $\in$  50 for each congress delegate.

#### Ball control at championships

Bowling balls will no longer be weighted at ETBF Championships and the ball check is here after limited to eligibility of balls as specified in the list of approved bowling balls, serial numbers and a minor visual inspections.

#### Altering surfaces of bowling balls

The WTBA Congress has decided that players in WTBA Championships, in addition to practise sessions before a block and in between blocks, are allowed to alter the surface of bowling balls also in between games.

This rule is only in effect for WTBA Championships and not for any tournaments approved by WTBA.

The new alteration rule is furthermore not adopted in the ETBF Constitution, which means that alterations of bowling balls surfaces are allowed during practise sessions before a block/squad and in between blocks/squads, but not in between games at any ETBF Championship or at any approved tournament in Europe, irrespective of the approved tournament is adopted in the European Bowling Tour or not.

If an organizer of an approved tournament outside the European Bowling Tour wants to adopt an option for players to alter the surface of bowling balls in between games, he/she must adopt such a rule in the tournament rules of that specific tournament.

#### Frequency of Championships in WTBA and ETBF

At the WTBA Congress it was decided to introduce World Championships for both genders with qualification. These combined championships will be held every fourth year, first time in 2013.

The decision influences the frequency of adult championships both in ETBF and in WTBA, where after a 4 years period looks as follows.

Federations will qualify from these two championships to the World Championships in 2013 Qualification rules for Europe will be decided at the ETBF Congress in 2011.

Britt Bröndsted from Denmark became for not less than the 12th time, the highest ranked woman in a tour stop, and her 100 points brought her to a position 6 with 296 points in the actual standing of the women's division of the European Bowling Tour 2009.

## Story 2009-44: EBT 2010 Rule changes

At a meeting in the ETBF Presidium on 8 and 9 October, it was decided to change the EBT 2010 Rules in the following three areas.

#### **EBT Masters**

As of the EBT Masters 2010, the pin fall will be carried forward from the 18 games qualification (three squads of 6 games) to the 8 player's round robin final, which at the same moment is reduced to 7 matches (no longer any position round).

Detailed rules of the EBT Masters format, which is the same for both the women's and the men's divisions, can be found in the EBT 2010 Rules, Articles 10.6-7.

The EBT Masters 2010 will be conducted in Plus Halle in Vienna Austria on 3-4 May following the conduction of the 1st Ebonite Austria Challenge on 28 April - 2 May.

To improve the atmosphere of the EBT Masters, the schedule has also been revised, meaning that evenings will be in use both competition days. On Monday 3 May the first two qualification squads will be played at 14.00 and at 19.00, while the third qualification squad will be played at 14.00 on Tuesday 4 May.

#### Possibilities for cancellations in case of a reduced prize fund

The rules covering a situation where the prize pool of a tour stop is reduced, has been amended to allow players to cancel their participation without penalty points will be added, and to give players the right to ask for a non-refundable flight ticket to be refunded by the organizer, if they want to cancel their participation after a reduced prize pool has been announced.

In both cases the cancellation and the refunding request must happen inside a three weeks window, beginning the day after the reduced prize fund has been published.

Detailed rules for situations with reduced prize funds can be found in the EBT 2010 Rules, Article 11.8.

#### Bowling ball adjustments and alterations

Tour stops are already, when it comes to adjusting and altering the surface of bowling balls, conducted in the same way as championships in Europe, namely without possibilities of adjusting and altering surfaces of bowling balls in between games.

To avoid any misunderstandings, rules ensuring all tour stops to be without a limitation in the number of bowling balls and rules limiting adjustments and alterations of bowling balls to be done only in between qualification squads and final steps, before qualification squads and final steps and during practice sessions before qualification squads and final steps, has been implemented in the EBT 2010 Rules.

Detailed rules for bowling balls in tour stops can be found in the EBT 2010 Rules, Chapter 30.

The first of the three matches was a battle between Lahti's own Jari Ratia and the PBA player Mike Wolfe, with Ratia as the winner 193 - 179.

Second match became a Finnish - Swedish affair, where Tomas Leandersson posted a 256 game to defeat Jari Ratia, who bowled 209.

It left the final to another Finnish - Swedish affair, this time between two bowlers, who have been in the very top of our sport for decades already. At the end, the laurel wreath was given to Sweden's Tomas Leandersson, who defeated Finland's Mika Koivuniemi 223 - 219 in a very tight final.

None of the top 4 players influenced the top standing of the men's division in the European Bowling Tour after 12/15 stops.

Osku Palermaa from Finland kept position 1 with 426 points (22 points in Lahti) and he enlarged the point gap with another 7 points to the long-time runner up, Dominic Barrett from England, who has collected 369 points (15 points in Lahti) so far and with another 17 points to third positioned Dennis Eklund from Sweden, who has 343 points (6 points in Lahti).

Osku Palermaa, the tour winner both in 2007 and 2008, seems to be unwilling to skip his option for a third tour victory in a row, and much begins indeed to points towards another victory for Palermaa.

Vanessa Timter from Germany became the highest ranked women in a tour stop for the first time in her career, and the 50 points awarded to her in Lahti was in any case her first tour points in 2009 at all. Previously Vanessa Timter only got points in one stop, namely 6 points awarded in the Vienna Open in 2005.

No changes occurred at the positions in the top of the women's division, where Nina Flack from Sweden is leading with 400 points (20 points in Lahti), Nicki Ainge from England is second with 391 points (35 points in Lahti) and Nicole Sanders from The Netherlands is third with 365 points (11 points in Lahti).

It is noted that Nicki Ainge lowered the point gap to Nina Flack to as little as 9, so who will be crowned as the 10th tour queen, when the last three stops in 2009 has been conducted, is still a very open question.

Like a number other tournaments this year, also the tournament in Lahti broke their participation records, since 225 players took part (216 in 2008) and 282 re-entries were played (196 in 2008), which in total is 507 entries in 2009 vs. 412 entries in 2008.

For the first time England's Nicki Ainge is topping the women's ranking of the European Bowling Tour 2009. Her move to the leading position came after being awarded 40 points at the 13th stop of the EBT 2009, the Ebonite International Luxembourg Open.

Also Nicole Sanders from the Netherlands moved up in the women's ranking, since she was awarded 50 points as the highest ranked women in the tournament, where she came as far as to the Semi Finals.

Nicki Ainge is topping the ranking with 431 points, followed by Nicole Sanders at position 2 with 415 points and the present tour leader, Nina Flack from Sweden, at position 3 with 400 points (Nina Flack was not present in Luxembourg). It is still a very exciting and open battle at the top of the women's division.

Nothing changed in the top of the men's division, where Osku Palermaa from Finland keeps the pole position with 437 points (11 points in Luxembourg) followed by Dominic Barrett from England with 381 points (12 points in Luxembourg) at position 2.

Paul Moor from England moved up to position 3 with 348 points after being awarded 21 points in Luxembourg.

Bill O'Neill from USA (one of the PBA players attending the stop in Luxembourg) took his first tour stop victory ever, after a final against Francois Louw from South Africa, who was defeated 504-452 in the two games final.

In the Semi Finals, Bill O'Neill defeated Nicole Sanders 494-412 and Francois Louw defeated Kent Doug from USA 396-377.

## Story 2009-49: II Federation Cup in Barcelona

After the successful conduction of the biannual tournament, the I Federation Tenpin Bowling Cup in 2008, the second edition will be conducted in Barcelona on 12-14 July 2010 in conjunction with the EBT 2010 Stop 13, the 32 Trofeu Internacional Ciutat de Barcelona.

The II Federation Tenpin Bowling Cup 2010, which is an invitational tournament, will again be hosted by the Catalan Bowling Federation. The purpose of the tournament is a worldwide promotion of bowling, where the concept of bringing the best players from each Zone in WTBA together makes the tournament both unique and an event of a great prestige.

In the tournament there will be 3 women teams and 3 men teams, each representing one of the 3 WTBA Zones. Each team will consist of 4 players, which, if not designated by the Zone before 1 June 2010, will be invited by the organizer.

There will be 7 disciplines in the tournament, namely singles women, singles men, doubles women, doubles men, all event women, all event men and mixed team of five - bakers style.

The 4 women and the 4 men, who will represent ETBF in the II Federation Tenpin Bowling Cup 2010 in Barcelona, will be the 4 highest positioned players in the women's respectively the men's ranking of the European Bowling Tour after the first 9 stops in 2010. Stop 09 of the EBT 2010 is the 7th Istanbul Bowling Open. If any excuses, we will continue down the list until 4 players of each gender has accepted to participate in Barcelona.

The organizer is offering a prize pool of 15.000 USD for each gender in the all event discipline. There will be a prize for each player and no player will be awarded a prize less than 800 USD. In the other disciplines various gifts and trophies will be awarded.

In addition to the above mentioned total prize pool of 30.000 USD, the organizer will pay for the hotel rooms of the players from Monday 12 July until Thursday 15 July (3 nights) and all meals for the players in the bowling centre on 13 and 14 July.

Finally ETBF has managed to attract a sponsor for the event, which ensures that each of the 8 players will get  $400 \in$  in travel support for their participation.

The Presidium of the European Tenpin Bowling Federation is of course again supporting this great sportive initiative and we hope, like it happened in 2008, that it will be just as well met by the players, who will compete on a very high level against athletes from the other Zones.

## Story 2009-50: EBT 2009-14

The second last stop in the European Bowling Tour 2009, The Ebonite English Open, conducted in Nuneaton on 2-6 December 2009, only changed the top standing of the women's division in the European Bowling Tour marginally and it brought no final result.

The winner of the tour in 2008, Nina Flack from Sweden, was not playing in England and she stayed at position 3 with 400 points. Nicole Sanders from The Netherlands at position 2 was awarded 8 points and produced a total of 423 points, while leading Nicki Ainge from England was adding 14 points to her new total of 445 points.

Even Latvia's Diana Zavjalova can still win the tour (363 in total), if she gets maximum 100 points in Qatar and the tree players above her gets zero or only a few points.

Vikki Burbridge from England, the later winner of the stop, was awarded 50 points and became the highest ranked women in a tour stop for the first time ever.

Vikki Burbridge won the tournament against Mads Sandbäkken from Norway after a 2-0 win (190-143 and 251-205). In the foregoing Semi Finals Mads Sandbäkken defeated Darren Cundy from England 2-0 (265-244 and 236-171), while Vikki Burbridge defeated Rob Thurlby from England 2-0 as well (308-256 and 231-188).

Also Mads Sandbäkken was highest ranked in a tour stop ever.

Leading Osku Palermaa from Finland, the tour winner in 2007 and 2008, kept the pole position in the men's division of the tour, and even enlarged the gap to his always closely following opponent Dominic Barrett a little. Palermaa added 25 points to his new total of 462 points, while Barrett added 21 points to his new total of 402 points and third positioned Paul Moor from England added 15 points to his new total of 363 points.

It looks like the third tour victory for Palermaa, but theoretically Barrett and even Moore, the three times tour winner in 2004, 2005 and 2006, can still make it.

## Story 2009-51: Platinum status in Qatar

Qatar Bowling Federation, the organizer of the 10th Qatar Bowling Open, which as Stop 21 is the last stop in the European Bowling Tour 2010, announces four changes in the tournament.

#### 1. Category

The Qatar Bowling Federation entered their tournament in the EBT 2010, which have four categories (EBT Satellite, EBT Silver, EBT Gold and EBT Platinum), in the EBT Gold category. However, since the tournament (having a prize pool of 120.000  $\in$ ) meets both the 100.000  $\in$ minimum demand and all other requirements for being positioned in the highest category, QBF have decided to upgrade the status of the tournament in 2010 to EBT Platinum.

#### 2. Tournament name

For easy reference, the number in front of the tournament name will be removed as of 2010, where after the official name of the tournament will be Qatar Bowling Open.

#### 3. Period

The tournament was originally scheduled to be conducted on 11-18 December 2010, but because of difficulties to attract media on 18 December, which is the National Day of Qatar, the tournament is extended with one day, so the changed duration will be 11-19 December 2010.

#### 4. Composing top 48

2 X 3 final spots, awarded to the three highest ranked players in separate standings, each of the first two days in the tournament (11 and 12 December), has been changed to 3 X 2 final spots, awarded to the two highest ranked players in separate standings, each of the first three days in the tournament (11, 12 and 13 December).

#### Brunswick Ballmaster Open 2-10 January 2010 in Helsinki, Finland

Concerning the magnitude of prize pools, the tournament in Qatar will in 2010 be closely followed by Brunswick Ballmaster Open, the first tournament to be conducted in 2010 with the new EBT Platinum status, and the only tournament with that status in 2010 besides the just upgraded Qatar Bowling Open.

The well-known top player and tour stop organizer, Kimmo Lehtonen, offers as much as  $105.000 \in$  in total for the fantastic 40 years jubilee of the tournament in Helsinki, and so far it seems to pay back, since it is expected that close to 500 players will find their way to Helsinki in January. If that's going to be the case, we will face a new high record of entering players in a tour stop since the very beginning of the tour in 2000.

## Story 2009-52: EBT 2009-15

Three women entered the last stop of the European Bowling Tour 2009, the 9th Qatar Bowling Open, with a fair chance to become the final winner of the women division in the EBT 2009; leading Nicki Ainge from England with a tour total of 445 points, second positioned Nicole Sanders from The Netherlands with 423 points and third positioned Nina Flack from Sweden (the tour winner from 2008) with 400 points.

From the beginning it looked like an existing battle between the three ladies, but it ended up with a status quo rather early in the tournament. Nicole Sanders ended a little outside the qualification field of 48 players, positioned 9 among the women and for that awarded 42 points in Qatar, while both Nicki Ainge and Nina Flack left the tournament already after the first final step, being awarded 50 and 46 points respectively.

Finally England's Nicki Ainge could be crowned with the EBT 2009 women division title after a fantastic season and a tremendous achievement in her career, after having been ranked 47 in the tour in 2008 and 135 in the tour in 2007; a big applause for Nicki after a great season in the European Bowling Tour 2009.

Britt Bröndsted from Denmark became the highest ranked women in the tour for the 13th time in her glorious career, which, among many international medals, includes 3 tour titles in the 2004, 2005 and 2006 seasons. Britt Bröndsted shares with the 13 highest ranked positions the top position of high ranked women throughout all tours together with Kirsten Penny from England.

In the men's division Osku Palermaa from Finland started the tournament 60 points ahead of the long-time runner up, Dominic Barrett from England and it looked from the beginning to be very difficult for Barrett to catch up.

Anyway, Palermaa was send out of the tournament in the final step 2, for which he was awarded 16 points, ending at a total of 478 points, while Barrett had the chance until step 4, where he missed the cut, was awarded 50 points and completed the 2009 tour season with 452 points.

The tour kept its excitement till the end, but at last Osku Palermaa tripled his tour victory series by adding 2009 to the already won tours in 2007 and 2008.

Previously also Paul Moor (third in 2009 with 403 points) is a triple tour winner in 2004 - 2006, while Gery Verbruggen from Belgium won four times 2000 - 2004.

A 30.000 € prize check was awarded to Remy Ong from Singapore and a 15.000 € prize check to Peter Ljung from Sweden after the two games final, where Ong won a close race 416-414 (198-218 vs. 191+223).

In the Semi Finals Peter Ljung defeated Britt Bröndsted from Denmark 444 - 397 (254+190 vs. 221+176) and Remy Ong defeated Andrew Frawley from Australia 435 - 405 (200+235 vs. 217+188). For their 3-4 positions Bröndsted and Frawley was awarded 5.000 € each.
